II. Words in Context

The renown of Park Güell among avid travelers is ubiquitous, as it perennially occupies a prominent spot on the roster of globally lauded urban green spaces. Nestled atop Carmel Hill in Barcelona, Catalonia, Spain, this enclave of verdant splendor and architectural marvels epitomizes the collaboration between Eusebi Güell, the visionary patron, and Antoni Gaudí, the luminary architect synonymous with Catalan modernism.

Park Güell serves as a testament to Gaudí's artistic ____11____, emblematic of his oeuvre's naturalistic phase. During this epoch, Gaudí honed his distinctive style, drawing inspiration from organic forms and imbuing his creations with an avant-garde fusion of geometry and imaginative ornamentation. Departing from conventional strictures, his designs exude a Baroque dynamism, characterized by an opulent profusion of shapes and volumes, free of the rational ____12___ or any sort of classic premises. In the design of Park Güell, Gaudí unleashed all his architectonic genius and put to practice much of his innovative structural solutions that would become the symbol of his organic style, and that would ____13___ in the creation of the Basilica and Sagrada Família.

In conceiving Park Güell, Güell and Gaudí envisioned a harmonious amalgamation of opulent residences equipped with cutting-edge amenities ensconced within a lush natural landscape, punctuated by artistic flourishes. Symbolism permeates the communal spaces, reflecting the shared political and religious ethos of the patron and the architect. The grand staircase, adorned with representations of the Catalan territories, and the Monumento al Calvario, originally conceived as a chapel, serve as ___14___ manifestations of Catalanism and Catholicism, respectively.

Moreover, scholars have endeavored to unravel the complex iconography woven into the fabric of Park Güell, discerning a myriad of symbolic motifs ranging from political allegory to religious allegiance, ____15___ with elements of mythology, history, and philosophy. Indeed, the park's rich tapestry of symbols, shrouded in an aura of mystery, echoes the zeitgeist of an era captivated by enigmas and puzzles.

III. Discourse Structure

From March 2020 – June 2021, the American Psychological Association surveyed nearly 15,000 pre-K–12 teachers, administrators, school staff, and counselors about their experiences with physical threats and attacks from students and parents. One-third of the teachers reported being threatened by a student within the year, including verbal threats, cyberbullying, intimidation, or sexual harassment; and 29 percent reported at least one incident from a parent. **__16**__

Educators, principals, and parents understand that kids are having a hard time, so it's difficult for them to agree on how to discipline students, how to provide them the additional support needed, and where school districts can find the funding needed to get students the help they deserve. __17__

One way is to demand from politicians and those who control school budgets to invest in hiring more counselors and interventionists. This would allow trained specialists to fully dedicate their time to students, just so long as they're not assigned to lunch duty, too.

__18__ These professionals can help build relationships with families and find organizations that can provide services to students when they need them.

Another way is through teachers' union. __19__ The local and state unions can help ensure discipline policies are being followed and can advocate on educators' behalf.

Kent Education Association (KEA) has been able to bargain for strong language in their contract to ensure safety protocols are followed. These protocols document the number of incidents that occur at a school. __20__ This sets in motion a series of actions to ensure educators are supported and protected. If two or three plans to curb behavior have failed, Martin, President of KEA, explains, the union can request that someone from the central office sit in a classroom with all parties involved until a plan is devised.

To sum up, students experiencing hardships coupled with few school interventions or resources can at times escalate school violence and put educators at risk. Fortunately, promising solutions have been proposed and teachers' unions are stepping in to help stop the attacks.
